

How to Start a Pressure Washing Business for Less Than \$100.

If you don't have the money to buy equipment you can start out by renting a pressure washer at a paint store or Home Depot.

At Home Depot you can rent a pressure washer for about \$95 for day.

You can pressure wash four houses in one day which will make you \$600-\$800.

This will give you a profit of \$500-\$700 for the day.

You do this for five days and you will have enough money to buy all the equipment you need to start operating a pressure washing business.

Your 1st step is to line up several jobs before you rent any equipment.

I would talk to family, friends, neighbors, and ask these people to talk to others for you.

You can set your own schedule. Schedule 4 houses for 1 day.

It usually takes 1 ½-2 hours to pressure wash a 2,000 sq. ft home with the driveway.

By working for friends and family it will give you some experience and confidence before you start doing work for strangers.

2nd Step: Rent a pressure washer and surface cleaner.

Use the surface cleaner to clean the driveways and any other flat work.

You can clean a driveway in 30 minutes with a surface cleaner.

Otherwise just using a wand with the pressure washer will take you 1 ½ hours.

Surface cleaners rent for about \$32 for a full day.

3rd Step: Buy about 3-4 gallons of bleach for each house.

You can spray the driveway with bleach as well.

Make sure to bring a gas can with you to refill the machine.

Another thing I would do is get the rental machine the night before you schedule the work if you can.

This will save you time the next morning.
